Swimmer Spotlight! Mike Webster



Tell us about your swimming journey?

My swimming journey started in Hong Kong, where I was born. My parents had a junk boat that we used as a family on the weekends. We would venture out into Repulse Bay and to swim and enjoy time with family. When I was 3, decked out in my water wings, I climbed to the top deck of our boat and watched my older brothers and sisters jump from the top deck into the

water (about 20 feet or so). I was/am very competitive, even at an early age. When my mom wasn't looking, I ran to the edge, peered over at my brothers and sister in the water below who, at this point were yelling to get my mom's attention, and jumped! I enjoyed many more jumps from that deck, which my mom never really got comfortable with. We moved to the Philippines, and I became an age group swimmer on the school swim team. We travelled to different military bases for swim meets with other teams. I loved the comradery

at swim meets then and I love it now. When we moved back to the US in the 80's I tried out other sports (baseball, football, diving) but in college came back to swimming — well, water polo. I played water polo throughout my college career at Diablo Valley College and at the University of Arizona where I went on to become the coach (story for another time). Throughout my adult life, I have participated in various master's programs, but my 6 years (I think it's been 6?) with the Terra Nova Aquatics Masters is the first place



where it felt like I was back in Repulse Bay, swimming with my family (and freaking a few people out from time to time).

When you aren't swimming with the TNA masters, what keeps you busy?

When I am not loathing the "test set" on Saturday or an IM heavy board workout from Natalie on Tuesday I am trying to keep up with and support my two kids. Loren, 15, is a freshman at Terra Nova High School and John, 13, is a 7th grader at IBL. I work for a video game company based out of Cyprus and have spent my career working in the video game industry. Maybe you have heard of some of the games I have launched? Tomb Raider, Marvel's Avengers, MLB: The Show, Resident Evil, ATARI Classics, etc. My much better half, Olympia, and I try to spend time adventuring the Bay Area and beyond when we can.

What is an interesting fact about you that no one knows?

In addition to thriving in a swimming pool, I almost died in one. My brother and I played Jacques Cousteau as kids and he locked me in a dog cage that ended up at the bottom of our pool!
